

Year 2 – How are some settlements different to Liverpool?



Key Vocabulary

Coast	Where the sea and the land meet.
Farm/farming	An area of land and its buildings, used for growing crops and rearing animals.
settlement	A place where people choose to live and build homes.
village	A group of houses and buildings, smaller than a town in a rural area.
Grid reference/Coordinates	Numbers or letters labelling a location using vertical and horizontal grid lines.
Leisure	Free time to do things you like doing.
City	A place where lots of people live and work that is larger than a town.
mountain	A large steep hill
city	A large town.
town	A built-up area larger than a village but smaller than a city.
hill	A naturally raised area of land not as high as a mountain.
River	A large natural stream of water.
Cliff	A steep rock face.
Rural	Areas outside of towns in the countryside.
urban	Areas such as towns and cities with lots of buildings.
pollution	Things in the environment that are harmful or poisonous.

Knowledge and Skills

- Know that Liverpool and Grasmere are very different places – one a city, the other a rural village – but that both are in Enland.
- Know that the physical features of the two locations are very different: Liverpool is a city by the coast and it is quite flat; Grasmere is a small village in the Lake District, surrounded by mountains and farmland.
- Know that the human features of the two locations are also different: Liverpool has lots of people living there and there are many buildings; Grasmere does not have many people living there and there are not many buildings either.
- People visit both places to have fun and take holidays, but people usually visit each place for different reasons.

Did you know?

There are not many shops in Grasmere – in fact there is no ASDA or Home Bargains.
