Key Vocabulary	
Atheists	A person who does not believe in any God.
Humanist	People who believe humans have the freedom to give meaning, value and purpose to their lives by their own independent thought.
Lord's Prayer	This is a central Christian prayer which Jesus taught as a way to pray.
Murtis	A humanised image or statue of a Hindu God.
religious artefacts	An object that has religious, cultural or personal significance.
Trimurti	The three most important Gods in Hinduism.
Shahada	First Pillar of Islam which represents 'faith.'
Prophet Muhammad	He was the chosen person to deliver Allah's message.
Spiritual	Finding a connection with something bigger than yourself – love, truth
Father, Son, Holy Spirit	Also known as 'The Trinity.'

Key Knowledge
 In Year 3 we explore Christianity, Islam and Hinduism.
