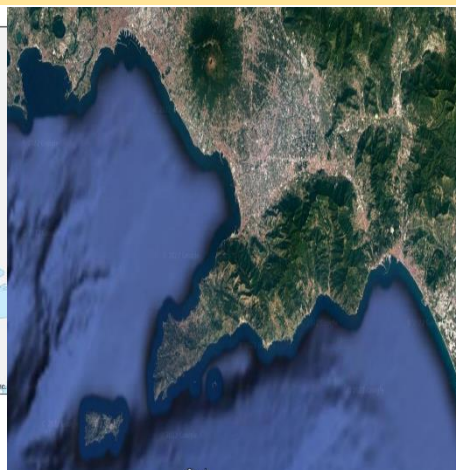
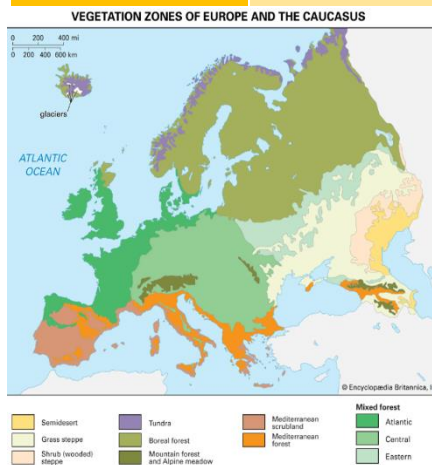
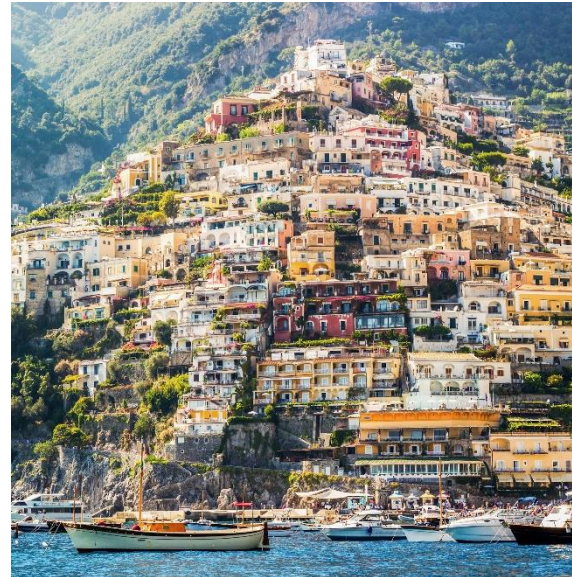


Year 4 -- Why is the Amalfi coast a contrasting location to Liverpool?

Key Vocabulary

Vegetation belts	Areas with distinct plant types due to climate, soil, height of the land.
Mediterranean	A large sea that separates Europe from Africa, stretching from the Atlantic Ocean in the west to Asian in the East
latitude	Lines that circle the Earth parallel to the Equator.
suburb	An area of a town or city a little bit away from the main part.
region	A named area within a country.
Time zone	An area on Earth that has specific time that all people living there set their clocks to.
Greenwich Mean Time	An imaginary north-south line through Greenwich, London, used for the UK time zone.
Population	The number of people living in a certain place.
Quality of life	The amount to which people are healthy, comfortable and can enjoy their life.



Knowledge and skills

- Know that the main vegetation belts of the Mediterranean are scrubland and forests.
- Know that the Mediterranean is a large sea that separates Europe from Africa, stretching from the Atlantic Ocean in the west to Asian in the East.
- Know that the Mediterranean has a dry, warm climate – very different to Liverpool.
- Know how time zones work and that the west of the Mediterranean is 2 hours behind the east of the region.
- Know that in the Mediterranean region there are many countries and cities and they can be located using lines of latitude.
- Know that the Amalfi coast is an area of Italy that has a long coastline of cliffs and beaches and is well known for its lemons and grapes (used for making wine).
- Know that the main settlements in the Amalfi coastal region are coastal towns, including Amalfi, Positano and Sorrento, and there is the island of Capri off the coast.
- Know that life in the Mediterranean is different to life in Liverpool – and that a lot of it is due to climate.
