- Easter, also known as **Resurrection** Day, is a holiday. Among Christians, it is a celebration of Jesus Christ returning from the dead. Christians believe that it is the holiest day of the year. Some people who are not Christians, celebrate it as the start of Spring.
- Easter is not celebrated on the same date every year. It is celebrated in either March or April.
- Jesus died on the cross about 2000 years ago in a city called Jerusalem. He was killed because he was causing trouble for the government and claimed to be the 'Messiah'. On the Sunday after he was killed, his body disappeared and he was resurrected.
