



# Year 1 – Our Locality – How safe is it to walk there?

## Key Vocabulary

<b>environment</b>	Everything around us, including the air, soil, water, plants and animals.
<b>next to/ far</b>	Language to describe position and distance.
<b>office</b>	A room of building used for professional work.
<b>house</b>	A building for humans to live in, usually with more than one floor.
<b>compass</b>	A tool for finding directions, with the 4 main arrows pointing to North, South, East and West..
<b>aerial view</b>	The view from a height above an object or place, sometimes also called 'birds-eye view'.
<b>distance</b>	The amount of space between two places.
<b>landmark</b>	A feature of a place which is easily recognised, for example, a bridge, a tower, a church spire.
<b>community</b>	A particular area where a group of people live.
<b>route</b>	A way from one place to another.
<b>symbol</b>	An object or picture which represents something.
<b>map</b>	A drawing of a place showing where each feature is.
<b>human/physical features</b>	Something which has harmful or poisonous effects in the environment.



### Knowledge and skills

- Know that Anfield is where we live and it is a part of the city of Liverpool.
- Know what we mean when we say 'human' and 'physical' features, and to locate some in the Anfield area.
- Know how to describe the position of landmarks and routes to reach them using directional language.
- Know that we can study landmarks (including the park, stadium and school) by using OS maps with symbols and aerial view photographs.
- Know that some roads are busier and more difficult to cross than others.
- Know how to draw a simple route map with a key and symbols.
