push/pull factors	Negative/ positive factors that make people want to move away from an area or attract people to move to an area.

Liverpool Docks and Liverpool One

- The Albert Dock was originally opened in 1846 and was at the heart of the busiest shipping port in the world.
- It had been neglected for many years – with work to regenerate the area starting in 1981.
- It was for many years a brownfield site but is now hugely popular with tourists and for leisure and recreation.
- The area is now used for hosting concerts, festivals and internationally famous events such as Eurovision and the Tall Ships Competition.
- Connected to it now is Liverpool One – a large shopping and entertainment complex first opened in 2008.
- The areas have become very popular for visitors, and many people now choose to live there.



Meatpacking District, New York City

- In the late 19th Century the area was mainly used as a huge market for buying and selling – particularly food.
- By 1900 the area was home to 250 slaughterhouses and packing plants.
- Other industries dominated the area, such as cigar-making and printing.
- Just like the Albert Dock area, the Meatpacking District was a brownfield site for many years.
- In the 1990s the area started to be cleaned up and designer clothes brands opened shops there.
- It is now a fashionable and popular area full of restaurants, clubs and shops.
- Just like Liverpool One and the Albert Dock, this is a popular place to visit as well as to live in.
