


Year 2 - What are the similarities and differences between Liverpool/Grasmere and Nairobi/Meru County in Kenya?

Key Vocabulary	
Soil	The surface of the area that helps plants to grow.
Forest	A place covered by trees at least 5 metres high.
Valley	A valley is a long depression, or ditch, in Earth's surface. It usually lies between ranges of hills or mountains.
Vegetation	Plants growing in the land.
Coast	The area where the sea and land meet.
Savannah	Flat grasslands with scattered trees and shrubs, usually found near to the equator.
Mountain	Land made from rocks and earth that rises high above the ground. A mountain is higher than 600 metres.
Grasslands	Wide open spaces covered by grasses.
Agriculture	The growing of crops or raising of animals on a farm.
Trade	The buying and selling of things.
Beach	A gently sloping strip of land at the edge of an ocean, lake, or river. It can be made from sand, pebbles or rocks.
Farmland	A piece of land used to grow crops and/or raise animals.
hills	Land that rises above the ground but less than 600 metres.

- Kenya is a country on the east coast of Africa and the equator passes through it.
- There are large cities in Kenya like Nairobi.
- The capital city of Kenya is called Nairobi and it is much larger than Liverpool – more than 4 million people live there.
- There are rural areas in Kenya just like Grasmere in the UK.
- In some of these rural areas a lot of food is produced and much of it is then bought in UK shops.
- There are different types of settlements in Kenya, just like in the UK.
