We are excited to partner with the National Farming Union (NFU) who create free interactive learning journeys for children. The children will watch and join in with the Festive Farming Quest in school with their teachers. Pupils will go behind the scenes of real British farms, using the fascinating world of farming and food production to deliver key STEM curriculum objectives and meet an inspiring line-up of careers across the industry. Below is a description of what will be covered.

### Festive Farming Quest - Key Stage One

Key Stage 1 are invited to join us for an action-packed festive farming quest at 11am on the 2nd December.

Francesca the farm elf has given us a list of jobs to help her get ready for the upcoming festive period. Join us on a quest through the countryside to visit four farming role models who will help us complete our tasks and collect our festive quest baubles.

The first stop on our festive farming quest is collecting a Christmas tree to hang our quest baubles on. We'll meet a Christmas tree farmer and learn where these special trees come from. What do trees need to grow? How long does it take? And what special jobs do trees do?

Then it's time to help Coco the shepherdess watch her flocks by night. We'll meet Coco the sheep farmer and learn how she cares for her sheep. What makes sheep's wool so special and what can we use it for? We'll earn our Material Magician bauble and hang it on the tree.

Next, we'll collect some Brussels sprouts for a roast dinner. We'll earn our Plant Pal bauble by meeting a Brussel sprout grower and learning where these festive vegetables come from and how they grow.
