We learnt that the original Olympics took place in Ancient Greece and that when the modern Olympics were founded, they took inspiration from competitions that took place in Liverpool in the 1880s. We learnt about the different parts of an orchestra including the string, brass, woodwind and percussion instruments and we even got to have a turn as the conductor of the orchestra!
