Year 2 - Difference between a seed and a bulb

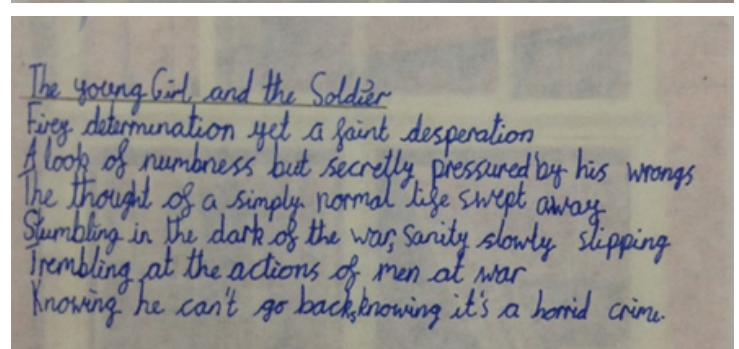
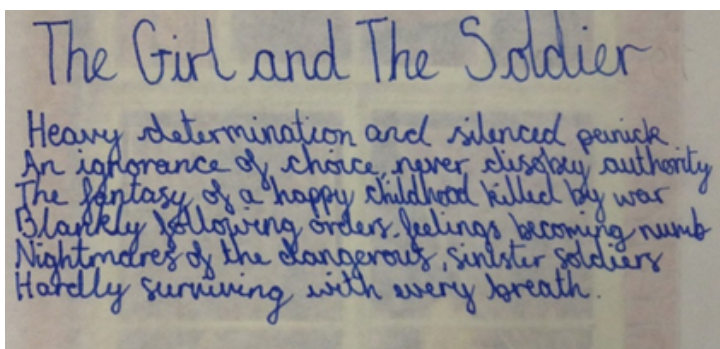
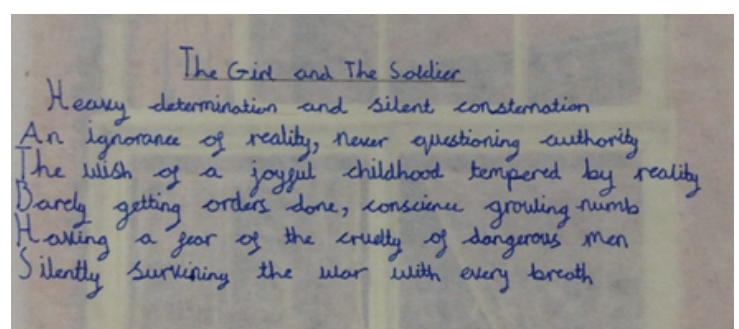
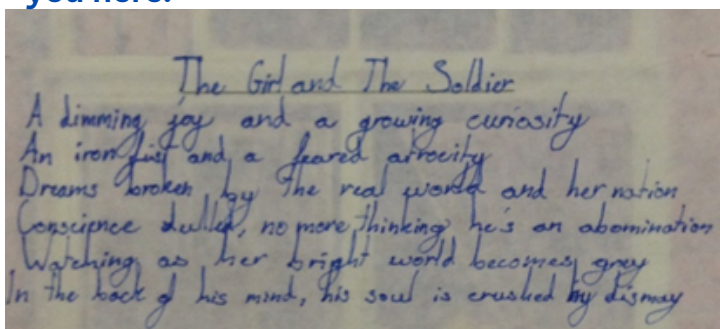
