The children really enjoyed seeing the otters being fed and discovering how they have adapted to their environment over time. We also had an opportunity to create our own species based on certain characteristics. We enjoyed the time we had to walk around Martin Mere to explore the wildlife. Our trip ended with a visit to the play park. Y6 had lots of fun whilst learning about the wetland wildlife.
