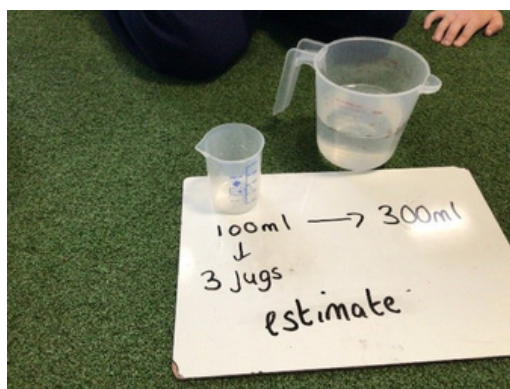
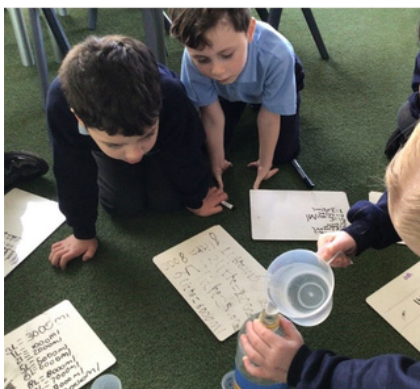
## ART COMPETITION

These are only a handful of the fantastic entries we have received so far. We are so proud of everyone who submitted an entry into the competition and we wish you the best of luck!

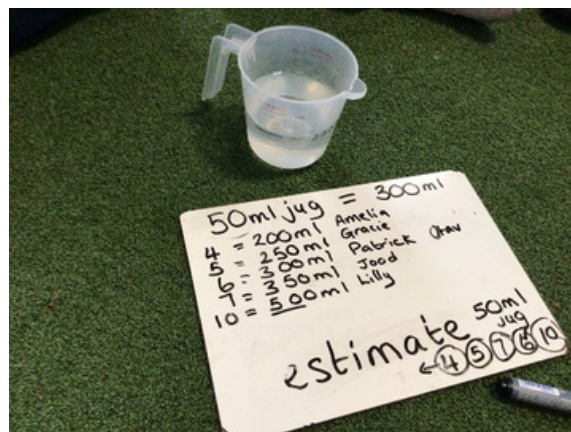


From desolate mountains,
